APA Division 10 invites submissions for the 2015 Annual Convention of the American Psychological Association in Toronto, Canada. Symposia

We encourage proposals for symposia, which develop a topic or theme across 3 to 4 talks. A symposium submission will have a better chance if it addresses a topic of broad interest to Division 10 members, if it has speakers from a range of institutions (instead of mostly from the same research group), and if it involves graduate students and early-career presenters. We will consider only 1-hour sessions; no 2-hour symposia submissions will be accepted.

Papers

As always, we will consider submissions of papers (oral presentations) on topics of interest to the Division. Unlike past years, however, we will not group papers into hour-long sessions of 3 or 4 15-minute talks. Instead, all submissions for free-standing papers will be organized into briefer, 5-7 minute "blast-style" talks. In general, we prefer symposia submissions over papers.

Posters

We encourage people to submit proposals for the Division's lively and collegial poster sessions. Submissions for Symposia and for Papers may be converted to Posters, depending on space and program variety.

Student Showcase

Students are encouraged to submit work for the Division's Student Showcase, a signature event that highlights and celebrates student research. Speakers will give a short talk—3 minutes and 1 slide, maximum—about their research. To qualify, speakers must be a student (i.e., undergraduate, MA, or PhD), and the talk must be about their research (i.e., they would be first author on its publication). Prizes are awarded to the top talks. Submissions should be emailed to Lisa Smith at lisa.smith@otago.ac.nz by December 1, 2014.

People should submit their proposals via the APA webpage (http://apps.apa.org/convcall/default.aspx) by December 1, 2014, 5 pm EST. Proposals will receive blind review from the Program Committee, which will select the final program.
